Your First Dance Lesson

Leotard with black dance leggings or black dance shorts over the top

Or Leotard with black or sheer tights/pantyhose underneath

Variations for classes

Cont./Jazz-Black dance shorts instead of leggings/tights

Tap – Short black circle dance skirt over leggings, shorts or tights

Hip Hop-Black dance pants/sweatpants instead of leggings or tights.

Hair in a tidy bun or stretch headband if hair short, No long ponytails or plaits.

No jewelry.

Shoes – *correct dance shoes must be from week three of the term in your first term to protect you from injury.*

- Hip hop: Black Canvas Sneakers or ankle boots (Like converse), lace up. (No sports sneakers as they have too much grip and can cause ankle and knee damage during spins and turns)
- Jazz: Black elasticated or lace up Jazz Shoes, (ballet shoes are acceptable to begin with.)
- Tap: Black or Flesh coloured Tap Shoes
- Contemporary: Bare feet or Toe Undies

Hip Hop shoes can be found at the Warehouse, Jazz Tap and Contemporary shoes can be bought at Paul Wright Dancewear, Columbo Street, or found second hand online or via other students at HSPA. Please contact Dale to make requests for items or use the waiting room noticeboard.

Rules of Lessons

Always be on time for lessons waiting in the waiting room. If you are the first class of the day you may arrive 5mins early into the dance space.

Parents should be on time to pick up students, if you are late someone has to wait with your child.

Message us on 021 899440 if you will be late or absent.

All students should endeavour to practice their work between lessons so that progress can be made.

Please note: Leotards can be purchased on your portal (Bottom left of home screen) for a special discounted price. Or you can purchase them yourself, along with shoes and any other dance accessories, at Paul Wright Dancewear, on Columbo Street. Uniform is designed to become part of costuming for our productions and for use in exams. Already having these items, makes production and exam times less hassle and expense for you. If you do not have this complete set of gear in weekly class, we accept other colours or similar clothing items as long as they do not impact your child's ability to dance.

Dance NZ Made Level Exams: Jazz/ Contemporary / Hip Hop

HSPA Medal Tests: Tap

These are all sat in Term Four. Exam seasons will usually be Early – Mid November, but exact dates vary.

Information to enter these exams is given at the beginning of Term three and in the Term Three News Letter.

Those wishing to enter will need to enter and pay the entry fee at that time in order to be able to sit the exams in Term Four.

Syllabus material is covered in class by all students so exams can be picked up at the appropriate level at any time. Students should have completed the full year of tuition in order to succeed in the exams as the material required is built upon across the year around performance pieces for productions etc. If you have not been at HSPA for the entire year, please discuss exam options with your tutor to see if they are the right choice for you.

Extra Exam lessons – For Trinity Exams we require students to attend four special exam classes. This is because these exams are solo exams and require a little extra preparation in order for students to do their best.

Christchurch Speech & Drama Competitions

These are in the first week of the July School holidays in Christchurch.

We offer our drama students entry to these at the beginning of Term Two.

Any interested students may opt to enter, Junior students will work on their pieces during class time but will require assistance from parents to learn words and to be taken to the competitions on the day they are competing.

Intermediate & Senior students may enter and will be given pieces for this but will be expected to prepare these largely themselves with less guidance from their Tutor. This is because the timing of the competitions does not fit well with the timing of our Intermediate/Senior Production. Private and Advanced students will be able to work on their competition pieces during their lesson as they wish.

Waiting before and after Class

Dropping off your children

- We have a waiting room. This should be the destination of all students arriving for a class at HSPA. (Apart from the first dance class of each day, who may enter the dance space directly)
- Please aim to drop your children off 5mins early for their class so they may use the toilet and exhaust their chatter with their friends.
- Please do not drop your children off earlier than this as we cannot supervise them.
 - Those year 7 and up can be left to wait in the waiting room if they can do so responsibly but they will not be actively supervised by HSPA staff.
 - Obviously if you are with your child, you may arrive early and supervise your own child in the waiting room or on the lawn out the back if this offers you convenience.
- Those waiting must be quite and respectful of the space and the other students who are working.

Picking up your children

- Please aim to collect your children directly after their class as they will not be supervised beyond the end of their class. We have a busy carpark and are on a busy street.
- Students year 6 and under must be waiting in the waiting room or on the lawn out the back. Nowhere else is safe for them.
- Parents must come in to collect their children and supervise them leaving via the car park or through the house and out the gate at the front.
- Students year 7 and up may wait in front of the fence and/or walk to meet parents as needed. Please be aware that once they leave the property they are no longer our responsibility.
- Students waiting must be quiet and respectful of the space and the other students working.
- If you are going to be unavoidably late collecting your child please contact Dale on 021 899440.
- Leaving your child after class may mean a staff member misses a bus or has to change their plans as our policy is not to leave the premises if a child is still awaiting collection. This is very unfair.

Parking at HSPA

Our Studio is increasingly busy and Ashley street is also increasingly busy, especially when our classes are on in the afternoon. Sometimes there will be three classes finishing and another three beginning. This is 6 classes (upwards of 48 different families) converging on the premises at the one time.

- Our car park is small, but if people park well, there should be space for 4 vehicles along the pathway between buildings and 2 at the end of the drive.
- Council requirements were that vehicles had the ability to turn in our carpark and leave the premises facing forward. Ashley street is too busy for us to back out the drive into traffic. We have had accidents when clients back out into traffic! I have a regular/larger car and I am able to execute a 3 point turn even in a full car park in order to leave facing forward. Please do your best to always leave the car park nose first!
- The driveway itself is wide enough for vehicles to pass, please keep left to facilitate this.
- If you have older children, consider parking along the street and allowing them to walk into class. This means the closer spots and those in the car park can be used by parents of junior students who need supervision coming and going.
- If you choose to park across the road, please walk your children across the busy road, and be in the waiting room to escort them across at the end of their lesson.
- Please do not turn into the driveway and stop there to let your child out or collect them. This can cause problems for traffic trying to come and go as they cause a traffic jam on the road behind you.
- Please do not turn up the neighbours' driveways, this irritates them and results in letters being sent 😞
- Arriving at HSPA from North (Ashley River end of town) is safer for turning into the driveway during peak times. When coming from Blakett Street end, simply turn into Edward Street at the round-about and turn left into Duke Street and then left into Ashley street.
- Leaving HSPA towards Blakett Street is safer also. Simply turn back at the round-about to head north. Or turn down Jennings place and via Good street if you are heading west.

These helpful hints should help you all, when dealing with the traffic issues coming and going from our busy studio.

HSPA Major Productions.

Please note – Preschool classes will not be involved in our productions.

General Show information.

- *All Students at HSPA(Except pre-schoolers) will be involved in the production for their level, as part of their class group regardless of whether they audition or not! (This includes Private students)*
- *If you cannot do the show for some reason, this does not mean you cannot attend classes in the show term – you just need to let us know. Learning routines and character work are all important to your growth as a performer, plus in some classes you will also be continuing with exam work and personal goals.*
- *Auditions are to cast the main parts and other extra parts outside of the class work.*
- *If you wish to appear on stage more frequently than just in your class, you ought to audition so that you have that opportunity. All Auditionees get extra time on stage.*
- *Auditioning, being cast in a role, and attending extra rehearsals is optional and does not cost anything.*

Intermediate/Senior Production

- This show is for students in all of our HSPA 'Intermediate' & 'Senior' classes. As well as Private students who are years 7-13 at school.
- Auditions for this show will always be towards the end of Term One.
- Those wishing to audition, must be current students of HSPA in Term One.
- Production week for this show will always be the final week of Term Two daily after school and at the weekends either side of that week.
- Performance will always be in the first week of the Winter (July) School holidays as part of the Kidsfest Event.
- The show will be staged at the Rangiora Town Hall and tickets will be available through Town Hall Cinemas.

Junior Production

- This show is for students in all of our HSPA 'Junior' classes. (Including New Entrant, and Upper Junior) As well as Private students who are years 0-6 at school.
- Auditions for this show will always be towards the end of Term Two.
- Those wishing to audition, must be current students of HSPA in Term Two.
- The final week of Term Three will involve a week of afterschool rehearsals in the Theatre for all Junior students at HSPA
- Performance will always be on the first Saturday of the Spring (Sept/Oct) School holidays.
- The show will be staged at the Rangiora Town Hall and tickets will be available through Town Hall Cinemas.

Rehearsal Procedures & Rules for Students.

Safety

Safety of our students is our number one priority when we are rehearsing and performing at our Venues.

Students will receive information about which entrances to use for arrival and departure. This is important because it allows us to be in control of who is coming and going within the venue, so please take note of these.

We will always provide all students with a safety briefing where they will be told the rules and regulations of the use of the space as well as emergency practises.

Once students have received the briefing, they will be expected to sign in and out at the stage door for all rehearsals and performances from that point onwards.

Only rostered parent helpers and crew are permitted back stage during our rehearsals and performances, so please ensure that students arrive at rehearsals and performances with everything they need.

We do not allow students to leave the premises during rehearsals and performances to purchase food from across the road, so please ensure they come with food and water to get them through the scheduled rehearsal periods.

All staff in charge at the venue, come with the prerequisite training and knowledge to allow them to work safely and effectively within the space. This is an OSH requirement that we take very seriously.

Late finish times at the Theatre.

Rehearsal timing can be very difficult to predict due to the extremely high number of variables involved. Therefore all start times are exact but finish times are approximate once we are at the Theatre. We want our students to enjoy the process of bringing their show together and so ask for patience from caregivers regarding finish times so as to avoid stress for all involved.

Students are allowed to have cell phones to communicate with their caregivers about collection times.

At most rehearsals we are happy for caregivers to slip into the back of the auditorium at a stated finish time in order to wait for their child to be finished.

Please do not bring toddlers with you for collection time if you wish to wait in the auditorium. If you need to bring a toddler, you may wait in the foyer of the venue and let your child know that this is where you'd like them to meet you after rehearsal.

Allow for the longer rehearsals to run late and do not plan other events directly after a long rehearsal.

Do not ask to leave a rehearsal either early or bang on time, this will lead to you missing valuable information given out in notes at the ends of most rehearsals.

If you must leave early or hard on the stated finish time, please ask this ahead of time so that you can just leave. Do not ask the Director in the middle of the rehearsal, if you can leave before it finishes. It is impossible for them to think on the spot about the implications of you being absent, whilst running a complicated rehearsal. Asking another staff member during a rehearsal is not acceptable as this person is not in charge of the rehearsal, the Director is.

Costume Costs at HSPA

Major Productions

All students participating in a show will be charged a one off \$15+GST fee for costumes. This is because many costumes are made specifically for a student or class group. This does not vary according to how many costumes a student requires or how many classes they attend. This is because we do not wish extra involvement to come with an extra price tag.

We do not charge a cleaning fee for our costumes or dry cleaner fees for specialty costumes.

During production season we usually ask for a hand full of volunteers to take a load of easy care costumes to wash and dry for us over the holidays. We do not ask all students to take their costumes home to clean.

We ask students to provide certain basic items of clothing to be worn with costumes themselves. This allows parents the opportunity to use what they already have or purchase the garments at a time that suits and at a price point that suits.

Please note:

The price has increased in 2018 as one of our key fabric wholesalers has closed down making costume prices go up considerably.

We order online where possible, but with tight turn around and changing class numbers, timeframes do not always allow for this.

We recycle and re-purpose our costumes as much as we can.

Some schools charge upwards of \$50 for costumes so we are confident this cost is not excessive.

Other Events

We do not charge for use of costumes for our other events throughout the year.

We are happy to loan students costumes from our cupboard free of charge for use in school events or competition performances as long as they are returned clean and in good order. Please contact Dale if you have a need.

We do not loan costumes for dress up days or parties as these events are particularly hard on our costumes.

Dale has directed for the North Canterbury Musical Society, Hurunui Players, several local primary and high schools as well as directing and/or production managing over 30 HSPA productions in the 22 years the school has been running.

Dale is married to Grant Hartley-Brown (who sometimes teaches dance here at HSPA) and has two daughters, Madison & Cassidy, who love their drama, dance and singing also.

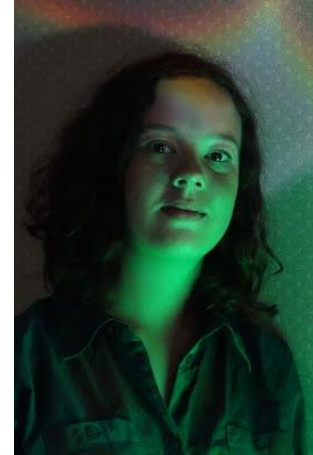

Terms & Conditions

Payment & Enrolment Policy, Waiver & Fees Policy

- Charges are per term, not per week. There are no refunds for students missing lessons due to other activities or illness.
- By enrolling with HSPA you enrol for the calendar year, until such time as you withdraw from the class. You will continue to be invoiced each term until you withdraw from class via email. You are liable to pay the term fee if you do not withdraw from a class before the term begins.
- In your first week of class you can notify us if the class is not for you, we will then adjust your account to just charge for that first lesson. Beyond the first week of term, students will be expected to pay for the term.
- An \$8 administration fee is added to your account if payments are not made by the due date.
- Students may not continue in class if they have not paid the previous term's fees.
- All bad debts passed on to Baycorp will be liable for the collection costs incurred, after all reasonable notifications have been sent.
